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INTRODUCTION

USING HUMAN RIGHTS MONITORING FOR SDG IMPLEMENTATION

The Danish Institute for Human Rights (DIHR) has made an initial attempt to link human rights monitoring with the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

DIHR produces an annual Status Report, which reviews the status of human rights in Denmark – and provides recommendations to further strengthen the implementation of these. Based on the 2014-15¹ Report, this paper concretely maps where DIHR recommendations relate to specific Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and targets. Thereby, it identifies priority areas for Denmark in its national implementation of the SDGs.

Beyond Denmark, the mapping provides an example of how human rights monitoring and SDG implementation is interlinked, which can hopefully inspire other National Human Rights Institutions, Governments and civil society actors.

DIHR 2014-15 Status Report reviews 22 thematic areas, where human rights are at stake. The areas of recommendations in the DIHR Status Report, which resonate with specific SDG targets are:

IMPLEMENTATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS (2), ASYLUM (3), CHILDREN (4), ETHNIC ORIGIN (6), FAMILY LIFE (7), DEPRIVATION OF LIBERTY (9), DISABILITY (10), GENDER (11), USE OF FORCE (12), HUMAN TRAFFICKING (13), RELIGION (14), FAIR TRIAL (15), THE RIGHT TO HOUSING (16), CITIZENSHIP (17), EDUCATION (18), FREEDOM OF EXPRESSION (21), THE ELDERLY (22).
