<b>of 23 June 2021, No. 756-p Kyiv</b>

**On the Approval of the Action Plan for Implementing the  
National Human Rights Strategy for the Period of 2021-  
2023**

1. To approve The Action Plan for Implementing the National Human Rights Strategy for the period of 2021-2023 (hereinafter - the Action Plan), that is attached to this document.

2. Ministries, and other public agencies responsible for the implementation of the Action Plan shall:

ensure implementation of the Action Plan within budgetary assignments and at the expense of international technical aid funds and other sources not prohibited by law;

input respective information into the Action Plan Implementation Monitoring and Control E-System at the unified e-governance web portal; and

publish information on the Action Plan implementation status for a respective period at their official websites.

3. The Ministry of Justice shall ensure monitoring of the Action Plan implementation at the unified e-governance web portal and every year:

until 20 July and 20 February inform the President of Ukraine and the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine on the status of the Action Plan implementation and publish information on the status of the Action Plan implementation on the official website of the Ministry of Justice; and

until 1 April conduct public hearings to discuss results of the National Human Rights Strategy and the Action Plan implementation for the previous year with representatives of public authorities, local self-government bodies, Ukrainian Parliament's Commissioner for Human Rights, civil society associations, academic institutions, international organizations and other stakeholders.
